APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM JULY 10, 2007

MOTION: It was moved by Mr. Haeussler and supported by Ms. Flack that the minutes from the meeting held July 10, 2007 be approved as presented. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

PETITIONS

MARK BRIAN DULAC

The Board received a petition for review of the Department's denial of an individual residential builder license application received February 16, 2007. The Department denied the license on the basis of a lack of good moral character as evidenced by his Controlled Substance and Pharmacist license having been revoked on September 22, 1998 by the Department of Labor and Economic Growth, Bureau of Health Professions, Board of Pharmacy Disciplinary Subcommittee.

MOTION: It was moved by Ms. Flack and supported by Mr. Haeussler that after careful consideration of the written petition and oral presentation, the Board moved that the grounds for previous denial are no longer considered a bar to licensure. The motion carried with Mr. Glynn abstaining.

The Department concurred with the Board's decision.

HERBERT MOMA FOGHA (MOMA CONSTRUCTION INC.)

The Board received a petition for review of the Department's denial of a corporate residential builder license application received September 6, 2006. The Department denied the license on the basis of a lack of financial stability as evidenced by a recent credit report. Mr. Fogha addressed the Board.

MOTION: It was moved by Mr. Parker and supported by Mr. Lewand that, after careful consideration of the written petition and oral presentation, the Board upheld the Department's denial on the basis that Mr. Fogha did not provide to the Board's satisfaction sufficient evidence to demonstrate financial stability. However, the Board did direct the staff to hold the examination scores valid until September 11, 2008. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

The Department concurred with the Board's decision.

LEWIS L. GREENE (LJ & D CONSTRUCTION LLC)

The Board received a petition for review of the Department's denial of a limited liability company residential builder license application received March 6, 2007. The Department denied the license on the basis of a lack of good moral character, as evidenced by a relevant criminal conviction history. Mr. Greene, along with his attorney Kevin Kilby, addressed the Board.

MOTION: It was moved by Ms. Flack and supported by Mr. Haeussler that, after careful consideration of the written petition and oral presentation, the Board upheld the Department's denial on the basis that (1) although the denial was not based upon the convictions alone, the criminal offenses were reasonably related to the practice of residential building, (2) sufficient evidence/length of rehabilitation was not presented, and (3) the consequences and nature of the offense distinctly bear upon the ability of a licensee to deal in an open, honest, and fair manner with the public. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

The Department concurred with the Board's decision.

The Board received a petition for review of the Department's denial of an individual residential builder license application received December 27, 2006. The Department denied the license on the basis of a lack of good moral character as evidenced by a relevant criminal conviction history. Mr. Haskins addressed the Board.

MOTION: It was moved by Mr. Haeussler and supported by Ms. Flack that, after careful consideration of the written petition and oral presentation, the Board upheld the Department's denial on the basis that (1) although the denial was not based upon the convictions alone, the criminal offenses were reasonably related to the practice of residential building, (2) sufficient evidence/length of rehabilitation was not presented, and (3) the consequences and nature of the offense distinctly bear upon the ability of a licensee to deal in an open, honest, and fair manner with the public. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

TONY MARK KENDALL

The Board received a petition for review of the Department's denial of an individual residential builder license application received May 21, 2007. The Department denied the license on the basis of a lack of financial stability as evidenced by a recent credit report. Mr. Kendall did not attend the meeting.

MOTION: It was moved by Mr. Parker and supported by Mr. Haeussler that, after careful consideration of the written petition, the Board upheld the Department's denial on the basis that Mr. Kendall did not provide to the Board's satisfaction sufficient evidence to demonstrate financial stability. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

The Department concurred with the Board's decision.

JEROME PAUL LUENEBURG (BOBALOON'S INC)

The Board received a petition for review of the Department's denial of a corporate residential builder license application received March 19, 2007. The Department denied the license on the basis of a lack of good moral character as evidenced by a relevant criminal conviction history. Mr. Lueneburg addressed the Board.

MOTION: It was moved by Mr. Lewand and supported by Mr. Haeussler that, after careful consideration of the written petition and oral presentation, the Board upheld the Department's denial on the basis that (1) although the denial was not based upon the convictions alone, the criminal offenses were reasonably related to the practice of residential building, (2) sufficient evidence/length of rehabilitation was not presented, and (3) the consequences and nature of the offense distinctly bear upon the ability of a licensee to deal in an open, honest, and fair manner with the public. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

The Department concurred with the Board's decision.

The Board received a petition for review of the Department's denial of an individual residential builder relicensure application received August 22, 2006. The Department denied the license on the basis of a lack of financial stability as evidenced in a recent credit report. Mr. Root addressed the Board.

MOTION: It was moved by Mr. Haeussler and supported by Mr. DiStefano that, after careful consideration of the written petition and oral presentation, the Board upheld the Department's denial on the basis that Mr. Root has not provided to the Board's satisfaction sufficient evidence to demonstrate financial stability. The Department concurred with the Board's decision.

SCOTT CLARK STEWART

The Department denied the license on the basis of a lack of good moral character as evidenced by a relevant criminal conviction history. Mr. Stewart addressed the Board.

MOTION: It was moved by Mr. Haeussler and supported by Mr. DiStefano that, after careful consideration of the written petition and oral presentation, the Board moved that the grounds for previous denial are no longer considered a bar to licensure. The Department concurred with the Board's decision.

BROOKS RAY TREAT

The Board received a petition for review of the Department's denial of an individual residential builder license application received January 31, 2007. The Department denied the license on the basis of a lack of financial stability as evidenced in a recent credit report. Mr. Treat addressed the Board.

MOTION: It was moved by Mr. Haussler and supported by Mr. Parker that, after careful consideration of the written petition and oral presentation, the Board upheld the Department's denial on the basis that Mr. Treat has not provided to the Board's satisfaction sufficient evidence to demonstrate financial stability. However, the Board did direct the staff to hold the examination scores valid until September 11, 2008. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

The Department concurred with the Board's decision.

MICHAEL KELLY ZIMMERMAN

The Board received a petition for review of the Department's denial of a corporate residential builder license application received March 31, 2007. The Department denied the license on the basis of a lack of good moral character as evidenced by a relevant criminal conviction history. Mr. Zimmerman addressed the Board.

MOTION: It was moved by Mr. Haeussler and supported by Mr. Parker that, after careful consideration of the written petition and oral presentation, the Board moved that the grounds for previous denial are no longer considered a bar to licensure. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

Failure to comply with the Final Order will result in suspension of any and all licenses, held by the Respondent. The Respondent may not serve as the Qualifying Officer of any corporate entity when their individual license is suspended. No application for licensure, relicensure, or reinstatement shall be considered until fine and restitution are paid in full. The motion carried by unanimous vote.
