ORDER

The following parties have filed joint applications for approval of an interconnection
agreement or an amendment to an interconnection agreement:

- Case No. U-13175 AT&T Michigan and XO Communications Services, Inc.
Application filed January 27, 2009 for approval of a twenty-first
amendment to an interconnection agreement (replaces the existing
Collocation Article XII and Collocation Rates in the agreement with
the Appendix Physical Collocation and Collocation Rate Summary).
- Case No. U-13710 AT&T Michigan and Matrix Telecom, Inc., d/b/a Trinsic
Communications
Application filed February 19, 2009 for approval of a ninth
amendment to an interconnection agreement (changes the name of
the party from Trinsic Communications, Inc., to Matrix Telecom,
Inc., d/b/a Trinsic Communications, and extends the term of the
agreement for three years).
- Case No. U-14694 AT&T Michigan and Arialink Telecom LLC
Application filed February 5, 2009 for approval of a tenth
amendment to an interconnection agreement (adds terms and
conditions pertaining to collocation power).

- Case No. U-15607 AT&T Michigan and DIECA Communications, Inc., d/b/a Covad Communications Company
Application filed February 2, 2009 for approval of a twelfth amendment to an interconnection agreement (replaces the existing performance measures).
- Case No. U-15709 Verizon North Inc. and Contel of the South, Inc., d/b/a Verizon North Systems and McGraw Communications, Inc.
Application filed October 17, 2008 for approval of an interconnection agreement.
- Case No. U-15796 Verizon Wireless and Westphalia Telephone Company
Application filed February 17, 2009 for approval of an interconnection agreement.
- Case No. U-15797 Verizon Wireless and Chapin Telephone Company
Application filed February 17, 2009 for approval of an interconnection agreement.

47 USC 252(e)(2) and (3) provides in part:

- (2) The State commission may only reject
- (A) an agreement (or any portion thereof) adopted by negotiation under subsection (a) of this section if it finds that--
 - (i) the agreement (or portion thereof) discriminates against a telecommunications carrier not a party to the agreement; or
 - (ii) the implementation of such agreement or portion is not consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity;
 - ...
- (3) Notwithstanding paragraph (2), but subject to section 253 of this title, nothing in this section shall prohibit a State commission from establishing or enforcing other requirements of State law in its review of an agreement, including requiring compliance with intrastate telecommunications service quality standards or requirements.

After reviewing the applications and amendments, the Commission finds that they should be approved. The Commission finds that the agreements and amendments are consistent with federal and state law and are in the public interest. Under 47 USC 252(i) and MCL 484.2359(2), the services provided under the agreements shall be made available to other telecommunications carriers upon the same terms and conditions.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

A. The interconnection agreements and amendments listed above are approved.

B. Approval of the interconnection agreements and amendments does not alter the duty of the parties to comply with relevant federal and state law and past and future Commission orders and rules.

The Commission reserves jurisdiction and may issue further orders as necessary.

Any party aggrieved by this order may file an action in the appropriate federal District Court pursuant to 47 USC 252(e)(6).
