



states that should any customer request net metering service pursuant to the Rules, Glacial will file an AES net metering program plan within 30 days.

The Commission has reviewed the application and concludes that Glacial has shown good cause, the waiver is in the public interest, and the application should be approved. Approval of the application will not result in an increase in the cost of service to Michigan ratepayers. Therefore, pursuant to MCL 460.6a, the Commission may approve the application without providing notice or opportunity for hearing.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

A. Glacial Energy of Illinois, Inc.'s amended application for a waiver from Part 3 of the Commission's Electric Interconnection and Net Metering Standards is approved.

B. In the event Glacial Energy of Illinois, Inc., begins serving electric customers in The Detroit Edison Company's or Consumers Energy Company's service territories, it shall file a net metering program plan with the Commission within 30 days.

The Commission reserves jurisdiction and may issue further orders as necessary.

Any party desiring to appeal this order must do so in the appropriate court within 30 days after issuance and notice of this order, under MCL 462.26.
