**ORDER**

On April 27, 2009, Wolverine Power Marketing Cooperative (Wolverine) filed an application pursuant to 1999 AC, R 460.612 of the Commission's Electric Interconnection and Net Metering Standards (Rules). In its application, Wolverine requests a waiver from Part 3 of the Rules related to net metering.

The Commission's March 18, 2009 order in Case No. U-15803 required that each alternative energy supplier (AES) file a net metering program plan by May 4, 2009. Rule 460.612 allows an AES to apply for a waiver from 1 or more provisions of the Rules. The Commission may grant a waiver upon a showing of good cause and a finding that the waiver is in the public interest.

Wolverine states in its application that its target market is member-customers with load exceeding 5 megawatts (MW). As of April 23, 2009, Wolverine had 20 member-customers, all of whom had load exceeding 2 MW. Wolverine also states that it would not entertain a member-

customer with less than 1 MW of load and anything less than 2 MW is unlikely. Based upon Wolverine's current and anticipated customer loads and the net metering program's limited size, it states that excess generation is impossible in any given billing period. Wolverine states in its application that should any new customer contract with Wolverine for whom the Net Metering Standards in Part 3 of the Rules could apply (*i.e.*, a customer with load less than 550 kilowatts), Wolverine will file a proposed net metering application in this docket.

The Commission has reviewed the application and concludes that Wolverine has shown good cause, the waiver is in the public interest, and the application should be approved. Approval of the application will not result in an increase in the cost of service to Michigan ratepayers. Therefore, pursuant to MCL 460.6a, the Commission may approve the application without providing notice or opportunity for hearing.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Wolverine Power Marketing Cooperative's application for a waiver from Part 3 of the Commission's Electric Interconnection and Net Metering Standards is approved. Upon customer request of net metering service, Wolverine Power Marketing Cooperative will file a net metering program plan with the Commission within 14 days.

The Commission reserves jurisdiction and may issue further orders as necessary.

Any party desiring to appeal this order must do so in the appropriate court within 30 days after issuance and notice of this order, under MCL 462.26.
