ORDER CLOSING DOCKET

On October 21, 2008, the Commission opened a docket in this case addressing the regulatory issues created by the passage of Public Act 286 of 2008, an amendment to the “Customer Choice and Electricity Reliability Act,” 2000 PA 141; MCL 460.10 *et seq.*, and Public Act 295 of 2008, the “Clean, Renewable and Efficient Energy Act,” MCL 460.1001 *et seq.* (Act 295). In the order, the Commission required American PowerNet Management, L.P. (American PowerNet), a licensed alternative electric supplier, to file with the Commission a plan for establishing a renewable energy program. The plan was to be filed within 90 days after the Commission issued a temporary order pursuant to Section 191 of Act 295. The Commission issued a temporary order in Case No. U-15800 on December 4, 2008.

On April 9, 2009, American PowerNet filed with the Commission a letter regarding its renewable energy plan. In the letter, American PowerNet stated that it was not serving any retail

customers in Michigan. However, in the event American PowerNet contracts with a customer in Michigan during the 2009 calendar year or thereafter, an application for approval of its renewable energy plan will be submitted to the Commission pursuant to the requirements of Act 295.

The Commission issued an order approving American PowerNet's renewable energy plan on May 26, 2009. On December 21, 2009 in Case No. U-14818, American PowerNet filed an application requesting voluntary relinquishment of its alternative electric supplier (AES) license. American PowerNet states that it has no retail electric customers in this state and has no intent to commence operation in the future. On January 25, 2010, the Commission approved American PowerNet's application and rescinded its AES license.

Because the Commission rescinded American PowerNet's AES license in Case No. U-14818, the Commission finds that further proceedings in this docket are not necessary. Therefore, this docket should be closed.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the docket in this matter is closed.

The Commission reserves jurisdiction and may issue further orders as necessary.

Any party desiring to appeal this order must do so in the appropriate court within 30 days after issuance and notice of this order, under MCL 462.26.
