The Partnership describes the project as a critical component in the nation's move toward energy independence and away from carbon-based fuels and evolution to home-grown renewable energy. Moreover, the Partnership asserts that the Project achieves President Obama's objective pertaining to infrastructure projects and a new electricity grid.

In addition, the Partnership requests that the Commission permit recovery of prudently incurred costs and authorize the requested rate treatment. Specifically, the Partnership requests that the Commission approve certain accounting treatments, rates, and incentives, such as approving a regulatory asset that will include expenses not included in construction work in process ("CWIP") and that are incurred in connection with the formation of the Partnership or development of the Project, as well as being amortized with interest over ten years for cost recovery purposes. The Partnership requests inclusion of 100 percent CWIP in rate base for the Project; approval for the recovery of prudently-incurred costs associated with the Project in the event the Project must be abandoned for reasons outside the Partnership's control; an incentive return on equity of 12.38 percent; and a hypothetical capital structure.

According to the filing, the Project is in the initial stages of development, has not yet been approved through a Commission-authorized regional planning process, and will require regulatory flexibility in order to get off the ground. The Partnership also acknowledges that it will need to work with RTOs, state authorities, and other stakeholders to develop an appropriate set of metrics to fully and fairly consider the benefits of the proposed project.

II NOTICE OF INTERVENTION

The MPSC is an agency of the State of Michigan, created by 1939 Pub. Acts 3, Mich. Comp. Laws Ann. § 460.1 *et seq.* As the Michigan regulatory agency having jurisdiction and authority to control and regulate rates, charges, and conditions of service for the retail sale of electricity in the State, the MPSC is a “state commission” as defined in 16 U.S.C. § 796(15) and 18 C.F.R. § 1.101(k) (2006). Accordingly, the MPSC hereby provides its notice of intervention pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.214(a) (2) (2006).
