ORDER

On October 6, 2000, Michigan Consolidated Gas Company (Mich Con) filed a complaint against Savoy Oil & Gas, Inc., Shareholder Trust and Thomas C. Pangborn, Trustee, (collectively, Savoy) regarding their gas purchase contract. On January 18, 2001, Savoy filed a counterclaim against Mich Con that also concerned their gas purchase contract.

On April 9, 2002, the complainant, Mich Con, filed a request to withdraw its complaint and represented that Savoy also agreed to withdraw its counterclaim, both with prejudice, pursuant to a settlement agreement reached between Mich Con and Savoy. The Commission Staff, who was the only other party to this proceeding, has submitted a letter of non-objection to withdrawal of the complaint and the counterclaim.

The Commission FINDS that:

- a. Jurisdiction is pursuant to 1909 PA 300, as amended, MCL 462.2 et seq.; 1929 PA 9, as amended, MCL 483.101 et seq.; 1919 PA 419, as amended, MCL 460.51 et seq.; 1939 PA 3, as amended, MCL 460.1 et seq.; 1969 PA 306, as amended, MCL 24.201 et seq.; and the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, as amended, 1992 AACS, R 460.17101 et seq.
- b. The complaint and counterclaim should be dismissed with prejudice.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the complaint of Michigan Consolidated Gas Company against Savoy Oil & Gas, Inc., Shareholder Trust and Thomas C. Pangborn, Trustee, as well as the counterclaim of Savoy Oil & Gas, Inc., Shareholder Trust and Thomas C. Pangborn, Trustee, against Michigan Consolidated Gas Company, are dismissed with prejudice.

The Commission reserves jurisdiction and may issue further orders as necessary.

Any party desiring to appeal this order must do so in the appropriate court within 30 days after issuance and notice of this order, pursuant to MCL 462.26.
