- Detroit Thermal, LLC may implement a Steam Supply Cost Recovery (SSCR) Factor of \$15.11 per thousand pounds of steam (Mlb) for the 12-months beginning April 1, 2010 through March 31, 2011, if the Michigan Public Service Commission approves its request.

PARTICIPATION: Any interested person may attend and participate. The hearing site is accessible, including handicapped parking. The Michigan Public Service Commission (Commission) will hold a public hearing to consider the December 31, 2009 application of Detroit Thermal, LLC (Detroit Thermal) as revised on February 2, 2010 for approval of a proposed Steam Supply Cost Recovery (SSCR) Plan and Factor of \$15.11 per Mlb for the 12-month period from April 1, 2010 through March 31, 2011, with the option for quarterly increases determined by the Quarterly SSCR Factor Price Adjustment (Contingency) Mechanism for the remainder of the twelve-months ending March 31, 2011. Detroit Thermal is also seeking Commission's approval to find its three-year forecast of its plans and projections through March 2013 to be reasonable and prudent.

All documents filed in this case shall be submitted electronically through the Commission's E-Dockets Website at: michigan.gov/mpscedockets. Requirements and instructions for filing can be found in the User Manual on the E-Dockets help page. Documents may also be submitted, in Word or PDF format, as an attachment to an email sent to mpscedockets@michigan.gov. Any person wishing to intervene and become a party to the case shall electronically file a petition to intervene with this Commission by February 18, 2010. (Interested persons may elect to file using the traditional paper format.) The proof of service shall indicate service upon Detroit Thermal's attorney, Matthew M. Peck, Fischer, Franklin & Ford, Guardian Building, Suite 3500, 500 Griswold Street, Detroit, Michigan 48226-3808.

Any person wishing to make a statement of position without becoming a party to the case, may participate by filing an appearance. To file an appearance, the individual must attend the hearing and advise the presiding administrative law judge of his or her wish to make a statement of position. All information submitted to the Commission in this matter will become public information: available on the Michigan Public Service Commission's Web site, and subject to disclosure.
